## Message from the Principal Brother Lawrence Maher, F.R.M.

Since the opening of Brebeuf in 1963, the school has greatly increased its student population. Today we have a student population of 1103 with a staff of 73.

If we are to believe the results of our OAC (grade 13) students, we are still considered a leader in schools in the Province. Over 45% of our graduation class of 1992 were Ontario Scholars. The magazine, Toronto Life, in its July issue, mentioned that Brebeuf was and is a Catholic school to consider when searching for a school with a difference and a good academic record.

Brebeuf has an excellent staff. Many began their career(s) here at Brebeuf, and are still here. Others were former students of Brebeuf who came back to teach, and then there are those who are new to Brebeuf. All are top notch educators. As a result one finds that dedication to the school has increased over the years.

Brebeuf is still a Catholic school where the principles and tenets of a Catholic school are followed. To be anything else would be inconsistent with our vision for our particular school in the future, and we do have a vision for the future.

I take this opportunity of thanking the Past President, Paul Fujiwara, and the Chairman, Frank MacGrath, for the work that both these gentlemen have done not only for the Alumni, but for Brebeuf College as a whole.
