President's Message


(ONGRATULATIONS

Brebeuf Today

Stand Up and Be Proud!

What a year! This has, without a doubt, being one of the finest years in Brebeuf's history. Students and staff excelled in all areas raising Brebeuf's reputation to new heights.

In sports, our squash, curling and badminton teams won the TDCAA; our junior and senior rugby teams are on their way to do the same. Brebeuf's track team had one of its best showings in recent history placing second in the TDCAA and two of our students are going to OFSAA.

This is the first time in thirty years that all three levels of Brebeuf's debating teams, novice, junior, and senior, made it to the provincial finals. Public speaking students won major victories on local, district, city wide, and provincial levels and a trip to the Nationals.

Grade 9 and 10 students dominated the MSSB Math, Science and Technology Fair, winning three first place awards and for the second year in a row a Brebeuf student participated in the Canada Wide Science Fair.

Our school bands delighted us all with their music, talent and skill at band concerts; Brebeuf's first Art Show was an enormous success, and one of our OACs placed second in a province wide poster contest.

Brebeuf students assumed major leadership roles in all areas. Seven Brebeufians were elected to the OCSCF (Ontario Catholic Student Council Federation), fifteen of our history students participated in a student's debate at the United

Nations in New York, and one of our students was chosen to be a member of Canada's National team at the U.N. Global Youth Forum in Boulder, Colorado.

One of Brebeuf's biggest successes was the production of <u>Jitters</u>, not only for its splendid performance but also for the friendship and community it promoted among numerous students and staff involved.

Leadership programs recently introduced at the school benefited everyone this year. The senior students developed skills for life as students teachers, coaches, and conflict mediators, while the junior level students profited from the extra attention and role models. In addition, students in our Co-op Program gained valuable work experience in some of the most prestigious placements employment in the city. Among our graduates this year are numerous Ontario Scholars, and most are entering the university of their choice.

Whether it was working with the elderly at Extendicare or Les Donnes, organizing a food drive, or raising money for Third World countries through fasts and other activities, Brebeuf students looked beyond themselves to answer the needs of others, and grew in the process.

Significant events were unfolding all year as the student council lead the way to rewrite the school's constitution and The "B" took on a whole new look. Parents, alumni, and students worked cooperatively in such endeavours as career day, a communion breakfast, and money raising activities.

Although our students' accomplishments outside of school were meritorious, the biggest successes, however, were taking place everyday within the walls of Brebeuf, as hundreds of students and teachers gained new ideas and skills, faced and conquered challenges, learned the meaning of friendship, worked hard, had fun, and grew intellectually, spiritually, and socially.

So to all of the students, teachers, staff, parents and alumni of Brebeuf we say, "Way to go Brebeuf, STAND UP AND BE PROUD!"

Each year in the month of May, five new members are elected to represent the school and its needs, but because of the work-to-rule situation in the previous term, no one had been chosen. Thus, for the first time in Brebeuf's history, elections were in September. The five new executives, President - Dennis Kim, Social Rep - Pete Norsley, Junior Rep - Jeff Ramlogan, Sports Rep - Matt Stockman, and Treasurer - Dan Ramlogan had to move fast in organizing a fun, spirit building year.

A couple of years back, Ironman tournaments were introduced at Brebeuf. It involved the drafting of team members to compete in intramural activities. This year's council decided to resurrect the competition. In the fall, there was Ironman volleyball. With winter came basketball, and in the spring, there was softball. Each event was completed with championship games and award ceremonies.

The social schedule kicked off with the school's second annual Cabaret Night. The cafeteria was transformed into a classy, romantic lounge, with chandeliers installed and fancy tables and chairs brought in. The evening involved dinner, live musical and comical performances, and karaoke. It turned out to be a hugh success.

Unfortunately, the same could not be said about the following event. The Christmas dance was looking to be quite a hot night until the first of a string of winter blizzards hit the city. The dance had to be cancelled.

Second term marked the arrival of Spirit Week. With winter in full swing, a lot needed to be done to build the spirit of the school. The five days were packed with homeroom challenges, pancake eating contests, games, and armwrestling competitions, a hockey tournament, motivational speakers, a caricature contest, and a ski trip. The week's success was evident in the high spirits of the school.

Next came council's second attempt at a dance. The students made up for the one they lost by packing the event solid. This was also the case with Talent Night, which followed a couple of weeks later. Unfortunately, their luck ran out. Their final event, Caribbean Night - an upbeat version of Cabaret Night, did not take off and had to be cancelled.

Mixed into the year were Candygrams to St.Joe's and Loretto Abbey, Joe's-Brebeuf volleyball games, and jacket sales, not to mention a highly successful Senior Formal at the Embassy Suites

Hotel. The five council members faced a lot of challenges, but with the help of other staff and students, they put together exactly what they had hoped for - a fun, spirit building year that went by fast for everyone.


Cooperative Education, an Invaluable Experience by Daniel Ramlogan

Throughout the Metro Separate School Board, there are a number of schools that offer a co-operative education program. This profound experience affords students an opportunity to become a part of the working world in the field of their choice. There is an in-class component where students are taught resume writing, communication skills, as well as proper conduct in the world of work.

Last year, Brebeuf introduced a coop program, open to a limited number of Grade 12 students. Their interests covered the entire spectrum of the job market. They all received vary impressive placements in areas of business, law, animation, forestry, banking, scientific research, hotel management, engineering architecture, teaching, recording, computers and actuarial analysis. Some of the employers had never taken a co-op student before, while others had previously accepted university students alone. However, all of their comments have been relatively the same - that, "The Brebeuf students have shown a great deal of maturity, enthusiasm, commitment and motivation. They have performed far beyond the expectations that were originally set." The feedback from the students has been equally of the same positive nature.

I am placed in a law firm on Front Street, where I am able to observe what the career of a lawyer involves. To date, I have been exposed to things that school could never teach, which has provided me with a much better understanding of what my career choices are. In addition, co-op gives me the opportunity to put the theory I have learned at school into practice. My exposure is not only limited to the firm, but also courtrooms, government buildings, and libraries, all located in the lively central business district.

The co-operative education program is one of the best courses a school could ever offer. The potential benefits of the experience are almost unlimited, as well as invaluable. Its popularity will surely increase in the years to come. If there are any alumni or parents willing or know of someone who can take a student, please contact Mr. L. months of training, planning and fundraising.


The Rugby Redmen would like to tank all those who supported our tour by either attending our dinner dance. purchasing a lottery




