
All Brebeuf College Alumni with current addresses will soon be receiving an important questionnaire.



# Co-op Education: A Successful Alternative

For the past three years, Brebeuf has offered an extensive co-operative program for students, which has been described as the "most useful course at Brebeuf."

Co-op is a two-credit program, with both an *in-class* and an *out-of-class* component. Students are given placements according to their career interest and are educated through handson experience. They attend work on alternate afternoons.

"If there's any course at Brebeuf that will help you in the future, co-op is it!" says **Brian** 

**Ramos,** a Grade 12 student who is a student of the program.

Brebeuf has had the privilege to place students with Toshiba, Volkswagen, Scarborough Grace Hospital, Sick Kids Hospital, Peat Marwick Accountants, Sullivan Entertainment, Unisys, Manulife, Royal Bank, H.H.
