# A Better Place: A Brebeuf Must-Read!

If you are still searching for the perfect Christmas gift, Alan Beaton '77 has the answer. This Brebeuf alumnus has just penned his first novel, A Better Place, published by Columbine Press and set in a fictitious Toronto Catholic Boys high school called "St. Ignatious". Since "A Better Place" was published in 1998, Alan has heard from many former classmates and fellow Brebeufians. Some alumni have even wondered if they were the model on which several of the more interesting A Better Place is available at bookstores everywhere including Chapters, Coles and Smith Books as well as Indigo. 


