New School Building

After thirty-six years in a school built for 450 students, Brebeuf College School is getting a new facility to properly accommodate 1000 male students. Funding has been approved by the Toronto Catholic District School Board and architects are currently working on the design. Construction could begin as early as next summer, and the new Brebeuf should open its doors in September, 2002.

Architects consulted with staff, parents, students, and alumni before beginning the new design. The new building will be a great

improvement: other new Catholic high schools built by the board, including Mary Ward and St. Basil-the-Great College, are all large, spacious, air-conditioned facilities.

The fate of the current building is unknown, and plans for the accommodation of students during construction are not finalized. We may retain the current structure and move the portables to other sites on the property. Brebeuf has always been an excellent school community despite its facility's shortcomings, preparing students spiritually, academically, and physically for their places in society.

Brebeuf invites alumni to make financial contributions to ensure that the new Brebeuf building matches the excellence of its academic programme and students.

Competitive Edge

Brebeuf still dominates math competitions at all levels! In the Canadian Mathematics League competition, Brebeuf placed 11th in Canada out of 300 schools and Mark Wang placed 4th out of 8,000 competitors. In the Toronto Catholic District School Board, Brebeuf captured first place in Grade 9 Pascal, and Grade 11 Fermat. We won second place in the Grade 13 Descartes Contest, with Magno Yu placing first in all of Canada. We placed fourth in the Grade 10 Cayley Contest.

In the Waterloo Math Contest, we won first place in Grade 12 Euclid. Our Grade 11s place fifteenth in Canada and seventh in Ontario, while the Grade 12s placed fourteenth in Canada and sixth in the province.

We fared well in other competitions as well.

Brebeuf's Crystal Growing Club, under Mr. Rado Krevs, placed second in the world competition held in Edinburgh, Scotland this summer.

Last year, two Brebeuf students, Patrick Ma and Parag Shah, represented Brebeuf and Toronto at the Ontario Debating Championships in Chatham, Ontario. Patrick placed eighth in the province!

The Junior Rugby Redmen were the Consolation Champions (third place) at the OFSAA Rugby Sevens in October.

Brebeuf students Cary Chen and Dennis Chu were finalists in the Catholic Register's "St. Valentine's Day Essay Contest" and had their essays published in that newspaper.

Brebeuf placed third at the York University's Science Olympics in 1999.


