

New School Building Underway

After years of patiently waiting, Brebeuf College's dreams are coming true and a new building is about to be constructed. It is scheduled to open in September, 2002. The school board has received government funding to the tune of \$24 million to build a state of the art high school for an enrolment of 1000 boys.

The facility will include:

- a double gym
- a 350 seat theatre
- a chapel for sixty people, dedicated to St. Jean de Brebeuf
- a large library with computer access
- large forum at the main entrance
- specialized music rooms
- TV studio

- MIDI lab
- exercise room
- retail shop
- greenhouse
- intra/internet access in each classroom
- NO portables!

Two areas that are not covered in the architect's design under the government's funding formula are the Chapel and some of the technology. To prevent the architects from taking money out of other areas in the building in order to fund these two projects, the school community, including the Alumni, are embarking on an ambitious fundraising project to raise a minimum of \$500,000.

Brebeuf's First Principal Passes Away

Robert Meagher M.A., M.Ed., Ph.D., C.C.T., Brebeuf College School's founding Principal, died on June 1, 2000. An outstanding individual, Bob retired as a Judge of the Court of Canadian Citizenship.

He is remembered as a man of many talents -educator, teacher, scholar, musician, author, mentor, motivator, theologian, and friend. He was the recipient of the Canada 125 Paul Harris order of Collingwood.

We at Brebeuf remember him best as the school's founding Principal whose talents as an administrator, teacher, and organizer were admired. He organized a school which became one of the outstanding high schools in Toronto. His demands for doing things always "first class" are well remembered by me. His concern for developing real "Christian Gentlemen" was always at the forefront of his administration.

On June 25, 2000, a memorial service was held in Collingwood, Ontario, at which witness to his greatness was given. Among the many who were present at this memorial were representatives from Brebeuf -- Father Don Beaudois SJ, Tom Sullivan, Peter Lee, Mike O'Driscoll, and myself. As Bob himself wrote: "And remember love is stronger than death."

Let us remember in our prayers with love, Robert Meagher.

Memories of Father Trainor

Fr. Lorne J. Trainor, a former Jesuit teacher at Brebeuf, died in the late afternoon of Monday 31, January 2000, at the Jesuit Infirmary, Pickering, Ontario.

I was a student of Father Trainor in the 1960s, when he taught me Latin, mathematics, and religion. Later, I was his colleague in the 1970s and early 80s. My respect and admiration for this humble man and his work always increased.

Father Trainor was born in 1923 and entered the Society in 1949. After completing the Novitiate at Guelph he studied Philosophy in Toronto. After his philosophical studies he went on to do his Regency in Kingston. Father Trainor returned to Regis to do his theological studies; he was ordained to the priesthood in 1960. He came to Brebeuf College School in 1965 and taught there until 1984.

My memories include the following: a teacher who was always present after school to offer assistance; a librarian who devoted countless hours to tending to the academic needs of the school; a lover of all teams from Montreal and a hatred of all teams from Toronto; a great fan of the Ferguson-Shack punch-ups; his favourite saying "Me thinks the lady doth protest too much"; and reading his breviary on late afternoon strolls around the campus.

Let us remember the humility and goodness behind that memorable smile.

Brebeuf Documentary Connection

Dr. Jay (Maurice) Smith, is a psychiatrist living in California who attended Brebeuf in its first two years. As an opponent of the Vietnam War, Jay was interviewed for a documentary about other protesters and what influenced them to reject the war. As Jay explains: "There was a movie made back in the 70's which was a docudrama of a book which in turn was drawn from a trial transcript. "The Trial of the Catonsville Nine" was an incident wherein several of us from Georgetown University led by one of our profs, the infamous Daniel Berrigan SJ, raided the selective service offices in Catonsville ,Maryland and destroyed the draft records. I made a speech at the Jefferson Memorial during the preamble to the trial about why wrong is wrong and right is right. I based it on the concept (which seems even more popular today, thank God) that a 'culture of life' supersedes all other forms and war defiles that objective. The speech is in the new movie which is an update on the principals of that event and the Chicago Seven, another group of radicals." For Jay, his years at Brebeuf under the Jesuits was part of the reason for this protest.



Below is a partial transcript from an interview he gave about the influence of Brebeuf on him:

The seminal point in my conversion [to anti-war protester] stems back to my education at a high school in Toronto. My name was Maurice Smith back then, before the need to change, and I was influenced strongly by my school's philosophy, my teachers' determination and my friends. The school was named Brebeuf High School and was at that time Jesuit by administration and nature. My teacher was a man named Les Luka who was determined to harness my big mouth. I was an academic under achiever but knew how to talk. He drove me into the first annual senior public speaking championships and I won. I knew, thanks to Les Luka how to work an audience. Brebeuf however gave me a scroll but kept the trophy which makes me mad now as then. They're apparently tearing down the building now, so God knows the fate of the trophy!

MS: How did the philosophy play a role?

JS: Aside from the usual Jesuit over achievement, the school had a REASON to excel. It was actually printed on my scroll and all awards they gave out, at least back in 1963/4. The reason was not for reward or gain. They said the true measure of a successful student and human being was 'they feel more keenly in themselves the impulse toward a perfection that is higher'. It is one of the best anthems for life I have ever heard. It is my motto to this day when searching for reason, and, no doubt gave reason to why we did what we did at Catonsville.

JS: Les Luka was a teacher of mine and he came down the stairs of Brebeuf during a class break on that lousy day, searching for me and Richard Snyder, knowing both of us had US roots. He simply stated that "the President has been shot in Dallas and there is no word yet on how serious." It was a big shock for Richard as he was from Dallas and felt an immediate affinity. There was no love in Texas at that time for the Kennedys in general. I remember looking at Richard and we both grew up in an instant - we were both entering draft status.

MS: You are here - What happened to Richard?

JS: Believe it or not the Brebeuf Alumni Association just reunited us. He had joined up but a mutual acquaintance had told me he had died in Vietnam. I'll avoid the obvious Mark Twain remark about exaggerated death. I can say that Richard was one of those good-looking, preppy kids that ended up in thousands and thousands of graves. I am glad he made it but I still see my classmates of subsequent years. I see them in my sleep and I still cry for those that didn't make it. I visit THE WALL all the time to say another goodbye. Its covered well by the movie script but I don't have knowledge of how the screen will finally reflect these influences. We are still trying to find some alumni from Brebeuf and Georgetown to fill in gaps on the formation of my anti war and anti military industrial complex views. We are all a product of nurturing by our friends, family and teachers. None of the events in Catonsville or Washington would have happened without these influences. This made the early end possible and the killing could stop. Even a simple high school class leads to this change in history.






