Presentation Brothers' Canadian Centenary

One hundred years ago, the first Presentation Brothers set foot on Canadian soil in Montreal and immediately began to do what they do best: form Christ in the young through Catholic education. Brebeuf, which has been associated with the Brothers since 1984, was the site of the celebrations for the Brothers' Canadian Centenary on Sunday, October 3.

Brothers from Toronto, the USA, and Ireland were joined by family, friends, alumni, past colleagues and current staff. The day began with a Mass in the Chapel following the official welcome by Br. Francis Schafer, Provincial. The Mass was celebrated by Fr. W. Rye S.J., Fr. L. Altilia S.J., and Fr. V. Quinn O.M.I.

Following the Mass, all gathered in the Atrium for a celebratory luncheon and special presentations. Br. Martin Kenneally, the Congregation Leader, was in attendance and spoke of the challenge of engaging young people in their faith and the need for vocations. Br. Denis Claivaz, a native of Montreal, highlighted the order's history in Canada and its special charisma.

There was also considerable student involvement in the celebrations. A beautiful mural depicting the Brothers' history in Canada was unveiled after much toil and effort by Grade 11 art students under Mrs. Cathy Pieroni. As a way to celebrate the Centenary, the Brothers have generously agreed to sponsor one student to attend the school's service trip to Ghana in 2011. The Student Council also marked the Centenary by creating a scholarship to enable a student in Ghana to attend high school.

A group of Brebeuf students and staff will travel to Ghana in March, 2011 to connect with our Presentation and Jesuit friends and perform volunteer work in schools and parishes. Students will earn a credit in Grade 12 Interdisciplinary Studies (IDC 4U1). We hope this will become a biannual experience and contribute to the "men for others" ethos of our school. The staff contingent consists of several alumni including <u>Michael Rogers</u> '<u>81</u>, <u>Michael Da Costa '92</u>, <u>Greg Rogers, '72</u> and Brother Henry Spencer, F.P.M. Brebeuf Honours Daoust & Butash Retirements

2010 marked the retirement of two of Brebeut's longest serving staff members. On Sunday, February 7th the Brebeut community gathered at the school for a special Mass and luncheon honouring <u>Michael Daoust '67</u>, Brebeut's "iron man". After more than forty years of service to Brebeut as a student, teacher, coach and Math Department head, Mike retired in January, 2010. After becoming the first alumnus to return to Brebeut to teach, Mike left 211 Steeles Avenue East having served under every Brebeut principal and vice-principal and having spent more hours at Brebeut than any other person.

Appropriately, Mike's retirement party brought together various generations of Brebeufians, including several of the original founding staff members and early school leaders such as Neil Gazeley, Tom Sullivan, Jim Barry, Peter Lee, Don Clattenburg, Hollie Doyle, Jim Hill and Joe Will. Other former staff who attended included Ailix Will, Fr. Rye, Mike Pautler '76, Joe Younder, Jacques Carron, Alexandra Stefaniw, Frank Bazzocchi, Joe Brisbois, Greg Rogers '72, Dan DiRocco and Shirley Gasparet. A very special guest was legendary Brebeuf teacher Fr. Don Beaudois, S.J. who honoured Mike with words of tribute at the podium. Mike was also recognized by his Math department colleagues, the Brebeuf student council, the Toronto Catholic District School Board and by his alumni colleagues on staff, most of whom were taught by Mike during their student days at Brebeuf. The Brebeuf Alumni Association presented Mike with a plaque recognizing this very special "man for others" for his tremendous contributions to Brebeuf.

What a difference 30 years makes.

This year's tournament was held on the weekend of May 28-29th at Chesswood Arenas. At least two milestones were achieved. The first milestone was reached when Team 2005 became the third team in the 28 year history of the tournament to win three titles years in a row. Team 05 was lead by goalie captain <u>Kieran Kennedy</u>. They went unbeaten in the round robin against Team 89 lead by <u>Andrea Palermo</u>, Team 08 lead by <u>Anthony Ciccarelli</u>, and Team 04-07 lead by co-captains <u>Brent and Jamie Tobin</u>, to face the only other unbeaten competitors-Team 80 lead by <u>Greg Loffree</u>. The Championship game was a repeat of last year's final and victory went to the patient youngsters.

Another milestone was the retirement of Team 79. Team 79 is one of the other teams who had won the tournament a number of times including three times in a row back in the old days. Team 79 was known for its strong core, a number of whom were members of the storied Brebeuf Redmen junior team that won the TDCAA championship in 1977. Some players on Team 80 also played on that championship team including **Blair McArthur** and **Phil Horgan**. Survivors and diehards **Dennis Tobin** and **Paul Fujiwara** from Team 79 were drafted to play for Team 80. On its way to the championship, Team 80 defeated Team 04-07. The score was 6-3, demonstrating the advantage of an extra 30 years of practice.


