News from Brebeuf

New Programs at Brebeuf: Brebeuf is pleased to introduce two new Specialist High Skills Majors: Arts and Culture and Health and Wellness. Brebeuf already has a SHSM in Information and Communication Technology. The SHSM program offers students the opportunity to explore a specific area or career of interest and to acquire the skills and experience that will assist them in their post-secondary pathway.

In Memoriam

Father Donald Beaudois, S.J. - In Memoriam



Longtime Brebeuf staff member Fr. Donald Francis Beaudois passed away on December 8th. He was in his 90th year and his 70th year in religious life. He taught at Brebeuf from 1964 to 1983 and is remembered by every student he taught as tough and demanding but also as an excellent teacher. Fr, Beaudois was both feared by the students and respected; upon hearing of his passing many alumni commented that they still remember the first twenty elements

of the periodic table. Upon his retirement from Brebeuf, the school's "Man for Others" award was renamed in honour of this Brebeuf legend.

Below is a remembrance of Fr. Beaudois by alumus and long time Brebeuf staff member **Michael Daoust '67**.

Father Donald Beaudois passed away this morning. I was alerted a few days ago by a faithful friend that Father Don had been in sharp decline over the past few weeks. When I arrived at the infirmary at Manresa this morning, I was informed that he had passed away peacefully at 5:45 am.

Father Don taught chemistry and mathematics at Brebeuf College in Willowdale from 1964 to 1983. He managed his classroom with a booming voice that could often be heard out to Steeles Avenue. Anyone at Brebeuf during his tenure has at least one good Father Beaudois story and that includes teachers and administrators.

He was a one of a kind man who inspired all with his passion for his subject and his dedication to his students. When I joined the staff in 1972, I was in awe of this legend of a teacher.

In fact, it took me over ten years to work up the courage to call him by his first name.

As a student, Father Don taught me that organized notes reflect an organized mind, that constant review is the key to academic success and that the classroom is a place for excellence.

As a colleague years later, he taught me that students always respect a fair and consistent teacher and that a good lesson is 90% preparation and 10% delivery.

But much more than that, he showed me on a daily basis what it meant to be a Jesuit; to be a man who sees the best in others and while demanding the best of himself.

I kept in contact with Father Don over the years since he left Brebeuf although his annual trips to the United States to do parish work in the summer made personal visits rather infrequent.

In the fall of 2011, I visited him at his residence at Manresa. Father Don suggested that my wife and I embark on an Ignatian retreat with him, a process that involved spiritual readings as well as monthly visits over the next year or so.

That experience has changed my vision of life as well as the understanding of my faith. It has also encouraged me to a little more humble and a lot more grateful.

As I bid adieu to Father Don today, I say "thank you, well done my teacher," and I'm mindful of something St. Therese of Lisieux wrote about her dear father;

"It was time, now, that this faithful servant should receive his wages; and it was fitting they should be paid in the same currency in which God rewarded, here on earth, His only Son."

They were among the first supporters of the school and the scope of their involvement ranged from fundraising, to chairing committees such as The Brebeuf Ladies Guild and the Benefactors Society (organizations critical to Babeuf's early development) to bridging the gaps between parents, student and staff. Both lived modern, Catholic lives dedicated to God and to their community. The Beltons were inducted posthumously and the honour was accepted on their behalf by their son, **Greg Belton**'76 in a very moving and emotional speech.

is a former teacher and chaplain at Brebeuf. During his time at Brebeuf Fr. Brennan was an enthusiastic, inspiring leader who gave tirelessly to the education and development of students in everything he did. He continues to bring a unique approach to helping students discover God in all things seen and unseen. Affectionately known as "Padre", Fr. Brennan consistently demonstrates an abundance of love, understanding, humour and appreciation of life. "He makes you feel so important in his presence" commented several former students. He not only is a "Man For Others" but has also encouraged so many other live their own lives for others.

Robert (Bob) Carty '69 may be a lesser known however no less impressive inductee. Bob was a journalist, a musician, dedicated family man, devout Christian and above all a true "Man For Others". Bob spent the majority of his life writing stories and songs about the less fortunate and those whose human rights were being inhibited. He had a unique ability to tell "human stories" in unforgettable ways. Driven by a belief that he had a role to play in changing the world, Bob spoke and he sang for those whose voices might otherwise not be heard. Accepting the Order on Bob's behalf were his son Michael and brothers Ken and Ed.

Kevin Duffy '79 is man who has faced adversity and risen well above it with courage, discipline, humility and faith. An active community leader, Kevin suffered a life altering stroke at the age of 43. Despite months in hospital and many more in recovery, Kevin found the strength and the courage to not only regain his role within his family but also to reach out to help others. Since his stroke, Kevin has returned to his community volunteering and gives tirelessly to help other stroke victims through seminars, presentations and active fundraising. He is an inspiration to us all.

The Brebeuf Ladies' Guild was among the first and most influential of parent driven organizations lending support to the school. "The Ladies" not only organized much needed fund raising activities for the school, but perhaps more importantly gave their support and guidance and "motherly advice" to a school that was at the time predominantly run by men. This balancing effort was incredibly valuable to the school's early successes. The many women who led and participated in the Ladies Guild are truly "Women For Others". The Order was accepted by past Ladies Guild President Ling Wong, accompanied by long time Guild members Velma Letterio and Donna Corso.

The 2015 Order of Saint Jena de Brebeuf Inductees are a truly remarkable group of individuals whose contribution to Brebeuf College and the various communities in which these people serve clearly demonstrate the values for which our school has always stood namely discipline, faith, integrity, excellence and the pursuit of the greater good.

At the June, 2015 graduation ceremonies the 2nd annual Martin Foy Scholarship was awarded to Santiago Sweet, Class of 2015.



Jesuit Canoe Pilgrimage 2017

On behalf of the Jesuits in English Canada, we are seeking your help to launch a unique re-creation of the 17th century exploration of our nation, following the route traveled by St. Jean de Brébeuf, Samuel de Champlain and their First Nations guides as they went by canoe to meet the Wendat people in their own territory. In the summer of 2017, we will undertake the Jesuit Canoe Pilgrimage to continue the work started by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, by promoting dialogue and mutual understanding between the First Nations, English and French people who came together to form the country we now call Canada.

In 1967, 24 Jesuit men set out from Ste. Marie among the Hurons in Midland, Ontario for 24 days covering 26 miles a day to reach the Montreal Expo '67. They were met with enthusiasm, media, and peoples of all faiths as they stopped in communities along the route.

As with the 1967 group, the 2017 Jesuit Canoe Pilgrimage paddlers will begin at Sainte-Marie Among the Hurons in Midland, Ontario on July 31, 2017. This is the historical site of the Jesuit mission to the Wendat First Nation dating back to 1638. The trip will conclude approximately 900 kilometres, and 30 days later, in Montreal.

The core group of paddlers will include approximately 11 Jesuits representing both the French and English Jesuit Provinces in Canada in addition to First Nations representatives and Jesuit collaborators, (individuals who participate in various Jesuit apostolic works from across Canada). The group will then be expanded through an open invitation to people to join the paddlers at various key sites along the route. By including representatives of French and English Canada and the First Nations, this pilgrimage will echo the original route followed by St. Jean de Brébeuf and other Jesuits alongside the First Nations guides and Voyageurs in the formative years of Canada.

We need your help, with tax deductible financial contributions, as well as donations of expertise and goods and services. The projected cost of the project is \$250,000 which includes logistics, equipment, accommodation, support and an education program. We have established some suggested levels for donations and sponsorship:

All donations, no matter the amount, are most welcome. This Christmas, may we continue to help others and follow in St. Jean de Brebeuf's path.




