Football Returns to Brebeuf

Football is returning to Brebeuf. After a thirty year absence, the Brebeuf Bulls will take the field. At school town halls held over the past year the students overwhelmingly expressed their strong interest in varsity football.

In April, 2017 the Alumni Association began a fundraising campaign to help bring football back to Brebeuf. While it was hoped that the program could in place by September, 2017 the school administration decided to defer the return of football to September, 2018 and allow more lead time to plan for the return of football and to raise the necessary funds.

In order to properly bring back football to Brebeuf we need the continued support of our alumni.

It will cost approximately \$50,000 to secure all of the proper equipment needed for both Junior and Senior teams. To field even one team will cost \$30,000.00. While the school fully supports the football program, its budget is very limited in terms of extra funds available; the onus is falling on the alumni to help financially sustain this initiative.

To date, just over \$20,000.00 has been raised through the very generous support of many alumni. However, we need additional financial support by January 31, 2018 to make this dream a reality and allow the football program to go forward.



We would welcome your support as we still need to raise additional funds in order for this program is to succeed. These expenses translate into a cost of a little more than \$500/player so we are asking all alumni to consider contributing in one of three ways:

- 'sponsoring a player' with a \$500 commitment. So far more than 20 alumni have met this challenge and we invite you to join this group. A full tax receipt will be issued.
- Donate \$100 to \$250 to help partially sponsor a player. A full tax receipt will be issued.
- Become a sponsor and promote your business while supporting Brebeuf

Principal's Message

It has been a fantastic start to the new school year. The past few months have been a whirlwind of activity. The year started with our annual gr.9 Orientation at Camp Muskoka Woods, which was a great success. Once again, almost all of our gr.9s participated, along with student leaders in gr.10-12. The camaraderie and sense of brotherhood began to form quickly at the three-day event. Following this, the Student Council organized its second Colour Me Beuf Charity Run, with gr.9 students being splashed with coloured powder as they jogged around the school. Over \$1000 was raised for charity.

In October, homeroom classes across all grades recited the rosary with our chaplains and religion teachers. Other events included Gr.9 Parent Orientation Night (formerly Curriculum Night), the Academic Awards ceremony, and Gr.8 Open House. In the first few days of November, Student Council hosted its first dance "Silence" (a very ironic name for this dance!), which was attended by approximately 250 students. We hosted our first Town Hall of the school year, where students had the opportunity to talk about issues that were affecting the school. As well, our gr.9 students participated in Take Our Kids to Work Day, while the school hosted 300 gr.7 and 8 students from a number of elementary schools for Take Our Kids to Brebeuf Day. Our Religion retreats took place throughout the two months, along with the Salesian Retreat; these provided students with an opportunity to reflect and further develop their faith. Finally, our Business/Tech department invited a speaker to do a presentation called "Funny Money" which focused on money management.

In mid-October, we received some new furniture for our Library/Learning Commons. The new furnishings include mobile tables and chairs, some café style tables and chairs, new shelving, and some lounge furniture that has quickly become a hit with our students.

We recently concluded our annual Used Clothing Drive, which brought in a record amount of clothing – 3752 items! – to be donated to St. Vincent de Paul. Coming up, we look forward to the Brebeuf Social Justice Symposium, the Can-Aid campaign (including Kiss-a-Fish), the Kairos Retreat, Christmas Arts Fest, and our Advent School Mass. Our music Jazz Bands will also be playing Christmas concerts at several elementary schools.

Some good news from last school year – we found out that in June that one of our graduates, **Alexander Demopolous '17**, was the top scholar in the North York region for the TCDSB. Alex achieved an average of 99.67%. We are so proud of his accomplishment!

On a different note, we continue to look for funds to assist the school in resurrecting its football team. Please consider making a donation to help us make this dream a reality for the 2018-19 school year. Football was identified as one of the main sports that students would like to see at Brebeuf.

Finally, wishing all of you the best during this Advent season. May you and your families have a very Merry Christmas and a Blessed New Year!

School News

- Brebeuf assisted several charities in 2017 including raising \$1000 for the Angel Foundation as part of the Colour Me Beuf run; more than 4000 articles of clothing were collected for the St. Vincent de Paul Society; thousands of cans of food were collected for Can-Aid and Brebeuf continues to support the Presentation Brothers' schools in Ghana.
- Rosemary Lavery retired after many years of teaching at Brebeuf and has been instrumental in organizing many alumni events at the school. Brebeuf has created a new award in Rosemary's honour to be given to the student with the highest mark in Grade 12 Accounting.
- **John Murphy '81** has retired after 30 years of teaching at Brebeuf, most recently as Head of Student Services. In recognition of John's many contributions to Brebeuf, the Alumni Association has renamed the "Most Improved Grade 11 Student Award" after John Murphy.
- Joel Ndongmi, Gr 11, was chosen as a Student Trustee for the TCDSB. This is the first time a Brebeufian has represented the voices Brebeuf held co-ed classes with St. Joseph's Morrow Park. SJMP students come to Brebeuf for World History and Brebeufians go to Morrow Park for World Issues.
- Brebeuf math students continue to excel in Advanced Placement exams. Of the twenty-four Grade 11 students and one Grade 12 student from Mr. Ryan's classes who wrote AP Calculus: nine students got a 5 out of 5 (Perfect or First Class University Standing); two students got a 4 out of 5 (Second Class University Standing) and eight students got a 3 out of 5 (Third Class University Standing).
- Over half the Class of 2017 were Ontario Scholars. 40 grads earned the Edmund Rice Award for being on the Honour Roll for all four years of high school.
- Brebeuf is offering two March Break trips in 2018 : a pilgrimage to Spain to connect with our Jesuit origins and a service trip to Peru in conjunction with the Loretto Sisters.
- Brebeuf started the Camp Olympia Leadership Weekend 25 years ago, and this past May the school once again hosted this experience for several high schools.
- In Sports, the Jr. Rugby team won the TDCAA Championship; Sr. Tennis won bronze at OFSAA; Gr 9 Flag Football came second in TDCAA; Non-Contact Hockey team finished second in TDCAA and the Junior Basketball Bulls were league finalists.





The Canadian Canoe Pilgrimage

The Canadian Canoe Pilgrimage ended its historic voyage on August 15, 2017, the Feast of the Assumption, at the Mohawk First Nations reserve of Kahnawá:ke on the south shore of Montreal. A core group of 30 paddlers canoed a distance of over 850 kilometres with another 40 individuals joining at various points along the journey. Despite the 1000's of bug bites, sunburns, days of rain and early mornings, a harrowing rescue on the Georgian Bay, and many bumps and bruises, the paddlers not only reached their destination in the planned 26 days, they formed close friendships and deepened their commitment to building community in doing so.

The goal of the Canadian Canoe Pilgrimage was to bring together different cultures that form the fabric of Canada today for an experience of encounter, dialogue and reconciliation. The mix of participants—Indigenous peoples, Jesuits, English and French, men and women, people of faith and non-believers, young and old—were immersed in the Calls-to-Action made by Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission. The hope was that together this group would engage the skills required for dialogue and building relationships outlined in these Calls-to-Action and value the need for immediate and active participation in order to acknowledge past and change current injustices faced by Canada's Indigenous Peoples. The experience of the group demonstrated that active listening, trusting and respecting the other's viewpoint, and developing the capacity to share our own vulnerabilities are foundational to this active participation necessary for reconciliation.

Pope Francis describes the word "encounter" as central to the way he thinks of Christian relationships. He encourages us to be fearless and look beyond our own needs and wants to those of others. He believes that we must be ready to 'step out' of ourselves as Jesus did: not just seeing, but looking; not just hearing, but listening; not just passing people by, but stopping with them; not just saying "what a shame, poor people!", but allowing ourselves to be moved with compassion.


This was the life changing experience of the paddlers. The pilgrimage provided concrete experiences of encounter, meeting the other as they are in very challenging circumstances. Because of the physical demands of paddling long distances every day, pilgrims were ripped from their comfort zones and were required to risk engaging others more intimately than many relationships afford. Each person was called to be both leader and follower depending on the gifts and strengths they brought to a given situation. Each was vulnerable at different points and needed the other. Each experienced a deep sense of dependence and mutuality—gifts that are rarely received in our world today. The pilgrimage also showed how time is a critical factor in coming to know and truly understand the other. Reconciliation takes time. It takes patience and acceptance that engaging with the other is not always within our control but that risking encountering the other as they are and as we are called to be is an essential step in reconciliation.
