Now a very familiar face to most Ontarians from his regularly televised COVID updates, **Dr. Kieran Moore, Brebeuf Class of 1979**, was appointed Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health in June, 2021. Kieran received his medical degree from the University of Ottawa and holds Masters degrees in disaster medicine and in public health. He has dedicated his career to public health, most recently serving as the Medical Officer of Health in the Kingston, Frontenac, Lennox & Addington Region, before being appointed as Ontario's top doctor.







Principal's Message by Linton Soares '02

My journey as Principal of Brebeuf College School continues to be very rewarding despite the challenges that leading a community in a pandemic brings. First and foremost I am so amazed by the Staff and students at Brebeuf who have accomplished so much during the past year. A special thanks to each of them for putting their faith into action in tangible ways!

Last year, as a Staff, we started a journey on refocusing and being intentional on celebrating and speaking candidly about our school Pillars. All stakeholders were involved in the process and what came out of the focus groups and feedback were four solid Pillars – FAITH, EXCELLENCE, TRADITION and FELLOWSHIP - that have now become the foundation for our community. Coupled with this, we started looking at our roots and as we termed it the two lungs – Jesuit and Presentation Brothers Tradition – and started exploring a Jesuit endorsement that would permit Brebeuf College School to celebrate and deliver Jesuit Pedagogy in the classroom and school. We had Fr. Len Altilia address the Staff at a PD Day in September, and did a wonderful job to set the stage for this pending endorsement with the Jesuits. I'm happy to report that at the time of this message, we are nearing ever closer to this endorsement that will further highlight our Pillar of Faith but will also allow us to continue to keep the Presentation Brothers and their Tradition in the forefront – there's a lot of overlap with both spiritualities!

With the refocus and commitment to our School Pillars, we have also kicked off a revamped House System and Mentorship System. The House System has all students assigned to one of six Houses – Jogues, Lalemant, Daniel, Lalande, Garnier, Chabanel – and students compete with other Houses for House prizes etc. This really speaks to our Pillar of Fellowship and building the amazing Brotherhood at Brebeuf College School. Our Sr. students, who applied for a Prefect Leadership position last year, have been absolute stars in supporting our Grade 9 students and have already brought our Grade 9s together for fun activities, intramurals, fellowship etc. We are also going to be looking for Alumni Mentorship for our Prefects, so be on the look out for an email in the not so distant future!



School News

Marketing Brebeuf - Brebeuf has been putting a greater effort into marketing the school, and so far applications for Grade 9 boys for 2022-2023 are up an astounding 50% over last year.

Staff Retirements - Brebeuf has bid farewell to Iona Martin, our teacher librarian, under whose dedicated leadership Brebeuf circulates more books in a day than most schools in the TCDSB do in a month!

STEAM – Brebeuf introduced a new programme in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics for two cohorts of Grade 9s. It is a highly selective innovation that we hope will both cement Brebeuf's academic tradition and attract new students. 2021 Graduating Class - More than 50% of the 2021 class were Ontario Scholars. 25% were inducted into the Blessed Edmund Rice Society (four years on the honour roll).

Math Update – In May 2021, Mr. Ryan's Gr. 11 Math class wrote the AP Calculus Exam. This test is almost exclusively written by specially trained Grade 12 students across North America. If a student does well on it (3, 4, or 5 out of 5), they gain exemption from first year University Calculus at most Universities and also gain preferential status in their applications to University. Of the 29 Grade 11 students who wrote it: 7 students received a 5 (First Class Standing); 9 students received a 4 (Second Class Standing); 7 students obtained a 3 (Third Class Standing). In all, 23 out of 29 Brebeuf Students have met or exceeded the performance of MOST first year University students in Calculus.

Community - Brebeuf continues to promote the "Men for Others" ethos with many fundraising initiatives including: Can Aid for the Good Shepherd Centre; clothing drive for St. Vincent de Paul; Christmas boxes for the less fortunate; and fundraising for the Presentation Brothers' schools in Africa.

Improving School Spirit - Brebeuf has successfully reinstituted a House System (named after the Canadian Jesuit Martyrs) and a mentorship programme for all Grade 9 students. It has already proved wildly successful in promoting involvement, school spirit, and a greater sense of belonging.

The Class of '71 50th Reunion What a Feeling. What a Rush. What a Story!

Introduction

Students in Brebeuf College's eighth graduating class moved on after their final year, and many did not keep in touch with other classmates. That has all changed — five decades later.

Here is the story of how a group of mavericks from the Brebeuf Class of '71 staged the school's first 50th class reunion celebration. It recounts how 2020 Alumni B Newsletter articles, a global pandemic and, above all, a determined, collaborative team effort combined to reignite and reunite a storied class spirit.



Chapter 1: Testing The Reunion Question

Our class reunion journey started on a note of appreciation. Two tributes to deceased Class of '71 class-mates appeared in the alumni newsletter (December 2020). In one of the articles, Brebeuf alumnus Paul Irish reflected on the life of his brother Mark, who passed away in February 2020. Sean Cosgrove also wrote a heart-warming story about classmate Mark Collins, who left us in March 2020.

On January 2, 2021, Pat Kahnert sent an email to Sean commending him on crafting a wonderful tribute to Mark Collins. Sean, who was testing the waters with other classmates, asked Pat, "What do you think about organizing a class 50th reunion?" It was a challenging question to ponder!

Before committing to leading a reunion effort, Sean and Pat agreed to run the reunion question by some classmates. They contacted Paul Adams, Marc Keirstead, Rem Langan, Sal Badali, Doug Cartan and John MacDonald; each alumnus responded positively. That was a good first step in the Class of '71 reunion journey, but there was much more to consider.

Chapter 2: Rounding Up Classmates

As the Brebeuf Class of '71 50th reunion co-leaders, Sean and Pat forged a plan of action to find alumni and secure their interest in building reunion momentum. Sean set up a Google Group to capture names and email addresses. They issued periodic Google Group bulletins, designed to keep members updated about developments, plans and opportunities to participate.

The task of finding the 1970-71 class of 42 students was often a long and winding road. We were shocked and saddened to learn that 11 classmates had died. We were delighted to find classmates who were keen on registering their interest on the Google Group.

Numerous search methods were employed — from Linkedin, Google and genealogy sites to classmates, siblings and church pastors. The Google Group eventually totalled 26 members or 84% of the living classmates.

Chapter 3: Shaping The Reunion Plan

The pandemic had a positive impact on our reunion success as classmates were more readily accessible and able to help out. Classmates engagement evolved as a hallmark of the Class of '71 50th reunion effort. Everyone was invited to participate in shaping and implementing a growing number of initiatives.

Once our membership reached half the classmates, we issued a bulletin looking for their reunion ideas. Rob Egli and Gord Hill

were among the responders; they both recommended an inperson event be staged that emphasized mingling. They also wanted to honour departed classmates and teachers. In light of pandemic restrictions, it was agreed that a virtual reunion should be organized.

By mid-March, we had garnered enough interest and excitement to declare to classmates that fall 2021 reunion events were in the works! We then added three more members to the organizing team, affectionately calling ourselves the "Core Five."

Rob Egli, Paul Smolders and Marc Keirstead quickly added their enthusiasm and expertise to the shape of things to come.

The Core Five's first order of business was to consider whether we should consider staging a reunion joint venture with the class of 1970. We are grateful to 1970 graduates Peter Barbetta, Mike Poole and Bill Corcoran for inviting us to work together. All things considered, our group felt that because we had so much reconnecting to do among ourselves, it would be better to focus on a stand-alone Class of '71 Reunion.

During our reunion organizing, <u>Frank MacGrath '82</u>, Chairman of the Alumni Association, approached the Core Five and D'Arcy McConvey to co-sponsor a memorial fieldstone marking the existing Larry Uteck Field. Class of '71 alumni stepped up!

An impressive 88% of the group contributed generously to the field sponsorship. The initiative succeeded in not only raising significant funds for the monument and a one-time bursary fund for Brebeuf students, but it also succeeded in bringing the group together.

The reunion organizing team hopes to organize an in-person gathering on the same day as a field monument unveiling next spring.



Tribute to Larry Uteck '71 - by Peter Barbetta '70

Reprinted below is an article that first appeared in the Brebeuf Alumni B in 2003 following Larry's passing in December, 2002.

Our Brebeuf community has lost one of its bright lights with the passing of Larry Uteck. On Christmas Day last year, Larry died after a courageous five-year battle with ALS.

Larry came to Brebeuf in September 1966 as a high spirited, competitive and somewhat rambunctious young lad from Thornhill. As a grade niner he barely made the school's Senior football team. The coach, Fr. Clem Kambeitz, with his keen eye for talent, decided to take a chance on the tough young kid even though he moved rather slowly. Larry had neglected to tell anyone that he was recovering from a severed Achilles tendon suffered in the spring of that year and that he was not to play competitive sports for a year. By mid-season Larry earned a starting position and thus began the football career of one of Brebeuf's greatest athletes. Larry's outstanding feats on the football field put the young school's name on the map. He led Brebeuf to



convincing victories over archrivals St. Mikes and De La Salle and was recognized as one of Toronto's best athletes.

Larry excelled at virtually all sports at Brebeuf but he was certainly not a "jock". He was an avid reader with a keen interest and passionate opinions in politics, world affairs and religion. He was an active participant in school politics and was always ready for a debate. He was admired by many of his fellow students but remained humble about his accomplishments. He was a generous and loyal with a patient ear for troubled friends. Larry was extremely proud of Brebeuf but was never shy about challenging authority or questioning traditional thinking. Many of his days at Brebeuf would end with the school secretary's closing announcement- "Would Larry Uteck please report to the office."

Following high school, Larry pursued his career in football as well as his academic interest in Asian studies. He travelled through China, Viet Nam and Cambodia shortly after the Viet Nam war. He had a distinguished career in the Canadian Football League as a hard hitting defensive back and kick returner. In 1983, Larry became the head football coach at St. Mary's University. His players loved him and often stood in awe when he would demonstrate proper tackling techniques without equipment. He eventually became the athletic director at St. Mary's and also was elected a councilor and then deputy mayor of Halifax.

Sadly, Larry was diagnosed with ALS in 1997. The insidious disease (as Larry once described it) eventually robbed him of all his bodily functions but it never came close to touching his high spirit. Through his illness, with the assistance of his loving wife Sue, Larry continued to go to work every day and to attend the St Mary's Huskies football games. There was not a dry eye in the stadium when the entire Huskies team charged into the stands to present Larry with the Vanier Cup immediately after their 2001 victory. It was a crowning moment for Larry's years of dedication to the sport he loved.

Larry will be greatly missed by his family and by his many friends from Brebeuf. The wonderful memories and his courageous spirit remain as an inspiration for us. God Bless you, Larry.

The Order of Brebeuf, created by the Alumni Association in 2012, is the highest honour we can bestow on members of the Brebeuf community, and recognizes individuals (or groups) for their contributions to the various communities they serve. The Order recognizes the standards and values for which the school has always stood, namely:

- Faith
- Discipline
- Integrity

- Hard Work
- Humility
- Success
- The Pursuit of the Greater Good
- Community and for always being "Men and Women for Others"

The 2020 inductees continues a new "tradition" at Brebeuf of recognizing our most selfless individuals and they join an impressive group of "Brebeufians" who have previously been inducted. We are reprinting the summaries originally published in December, 2020.

George Macri '69

Since his graduation more than 50 years ago, George has been one of the most dedicated alumni of Brebeuf College School and has truly demonstrated what it means to be a "man for others". George has consistently supported Brebeuf through regular financial contributions and donations. Over the past thirty five years George has helped to recognize and honour some of Brebeuf s earliest faculty members by establishing academic awards and scholarships in the names of former teachers like O'Neil Gazeley, Lou Puccini and E.J. Barry.

Every time Brebeuf has run any kind of fundraising campaign George has contributed, whether it was for the "New Building Fund" campaign in 1999-2000 or the return of football in 2018. George is a stalwart attendee at all of the alumni events. Moreover, he is always the first person to offer items such as his own Leaf tickets to the silent auction or raffle at our annual pub nights and golf tournaments.

During the 50th Anniversary celebrations in 2013-14, George went out of his way to donate back to Brebeuf some very unique Jesuit artifacts that he had been able to acquire; he wanted them to be at Brebeuf as a tribute to the religious order that founded the school.

George makes his many contributions to Brebeuf very quietly and without any request for recognition or fanfare. In addition to his numerous financial contributions to Brebeuf, George has been a long standing supporter of The Jesuits of Canada and his community involvement goes far beyond Brebeuf. He has been a long time Board Member, donor and volunteer with the Providence Centre Health Care Foundation as well as with charitable organizations such as Cystic Fibrosis Canada, Camp Winston and the Amarok Society.

Jim Morris '77 (posthumously)

Jim Morris was the very definition of a "Man for Others". When the Brebeuf Alumni Association was formed in 1982, Jim was one of the founding members of the Alumni Executive committee. For years Jim helped to convene both the annual alumni hockey tournament and the alumni golf tournament. During Brebeuf's 25th Anniversary celebrations in 1988, Jim lead the creation of the Brebeuf Sports Hall of Fame and was responsible for researching many of the archives on display during those celebrations.

Jim served on the Alumni executive for over ten years and was always a very loyal Brebeufian who helped the school in numerous ways. Jim gave countless hours of his time and talent to helping his alma mater, always returning to Brebeuf to speak at Career Day, to help organize events or to help promote a story the school wanted covered in the media. When Brebeuf or one of its alumni needed his help, Jim was truly a man for others.

Even during his battle with cancer Jim continued to support Brebeuf, serving as one of the key organizers of the "Old School Alumni Reunion" in January, 2002. This event celebrated the closing of the original school building and marked the 25th Anniversary of the Junior Hockey Team's TDCAA Championship in 1977 (for which Jim served as the team manager & trainer). At this event Jim was recognized with Brebeuf's "Man for Others" Award for his tireless dedication over the previously 30 years.

After leaving Brebeuf in 1977 Jim attended Fanshawe College and then embarked on a lengthy career in radio, primarily with CKO News and 680 News in Toronto. While the demands of reporting on the Toronto police and fire beats was very stressful, Jim was always a complete professional and was recognized with numerous awards throughout his distinguished career. Following his death in March, 2002, the Brebeuf Alumni Association and Brebeuf College established the Jim Morris Journalism Award to the graduating student excelling in journalism and mass media studies at Brebeuf.

Tom McGouran '76

Tom McGouran is one of the most positive and caring people that you are ever going to meet. He grew up with five brothers and attended St. Gabriel's Parish. He attended Brebeuf in grades nine and ten and then went to Earl Haig for grade eleven. He met Neil Gazely in the summer who said, "McGouran, what the hell are you doing at Earl Haig?". Tom returned to Brebeuf for his final two years of high school.

Tom has pursued a career in broadcasting for the past forty-one years. Because of his position he has had the advantage and pleasure to use this platform and recognition to help out many worthwhile causes, organizations and charities. Tom has led a live radio-a-thon which broadcasts for three days straight for the past 20+ years to raise funds and awareness for organizations in need. Those include The Salvation Army, The Christmas Cheer board of Winnipeg, Winnipeg Harvest and Siloam Mission. These programs have raised tens of thousands of dollars for the less fortunate.

Tom has also organized a radio-a-thon for Cancer Care Manitoba after the death of his radio partner's wife. He has since MC'd a "battle of the bands" for Cancer Care Manitoba for the past seven years.

Tom has been the event director of Play 4 on 4 ball hockey tournament held annually that includes 350 teams to benefit charities such as The United Way, True North Youth Foundation and The Movement Center of Winnipeg (a charity that helps all with mobility issues.)

Other organizations that have benefitted from Tom's generosity include The Winnipeg Humane Society, The Children's Rehabilitation Center, Ride for Dad (fight against prostate cancer), Habitat for Humanity, Meals on Wheels, Big Brothers and Sisters of Winnipeg, Never Alone Foundation, Children's Wish Foundation and A and O Services for Older Adults.

Tawfiq S. Rangwala '95




