
Jesuit Endorsement Update - Kairos Retreat Program

Brebeuf College offers a transformative spiritual experience through its Kairos retreat program thanks to the financial support of alumni like **Robert Baldauf '82** and **Barry McInerney '81**. The word Kairos comes from the Greek term meaning, "the Lord's time", and is offered in all Jesuit Catholic high schools across North America. First introduced to Brebeuf in March 2009, when six students and three staff travelled to Buffalo to visit Canisius High School, where they participated in the very first Kairos retreat. Thanks to Chris Krall S.J., a Jesuit scholastic and volunteer at Brebeuf, several of our staff and students travelled to Buffalo, N.Y. to participate in Canisius High School's 95th Kairos Retreat. This experience along with the indispensable support of Fr. Fred Betti S.J., the Chaplain at Canisius, served to launch the Kairos Leadership Retreat Program at Brebeuf in 2010. Since this beginning, Brebeuf has continued to form senior students in this servant-leadership retreat program, completing Kairos XVIII in October 2023.

This three-day, two-night retreat is held annually at the Manresa Jesuit Spiritual Renewal Centre in Pickering and hosts 35 to 42 Grade 11 and 12 students. The leadership team is comprised of six Grade 12 students, seven adult staff and (1) chaplain from the archdiocese of Toronto. In addition to personal faith formation the Kairos program strives to engage and foster confident, Christ-like student leaders within our community and for the world. The students engage in challenging and reflective activities intended to deepen their social, emotional, and spiritual maturity and strengthen their relationships with Christ and others. Ultimately, the Kairos Leadership Retreat Program challenges Brebeuf's senior students to actualize the words of St. Ignatius of Loyola to "Go forth and set the world on fire." in accordance with the Jesuit motto: Ad majorem Dei gloriam!

In my second year as principal, I am continually astounded by the array of events that showcase the vibrant community thriving at Brebeuf College School. Whether it's in academics, athletics, extracurricular activities, or spiritual growth, the distinctiveness of Brebeuf remains evident. One of the hallmarks setting Brebeuf apart is the unwavering and generous support from our alumni, for which we are deeply grateful. 

- The football programme continues to grow and thrive under teachers Chris Bayley and <u>Brad Chin You '98</u> with the assistance of community Coaches. The team made the TDCAA Finals and narrowly lost to Chaminade.
- Brebeuf continues to demonstrate charity through such initiatives as Clothing Drive for St. Vincent de Paul; Beuf Boxes for the less fortunate at Christmas; Can-Aid for the Food Bank at Our Lady of Lourdes; and fundraising for the Presentation Brothers' Schools in Africa.
- Brebeuf has increased marketing the school, and so far applications for Grade 9 boys for 2023-2024 are up an astounding fifty boys over previous years.

- 2023 Graduating Class More than 50% of the 2023 class were Ontario Scholars. 25% were inducted into the Blessed Edmund Rice Society (four years on the honour roll). Over thirty awards were given, many named after former Brebeuf teachers and students and supported by alumni.
- Improving School Spirit Brebeuf has successfully reinstituted a House System (named after the Canadian Jesuit Martyrs).
 It has proved wildly successful in promoting involvement, school spirit, and a greater sense of belonging.
- Math Update: In Math News, 25 Grade 11 students wrote the AP Calculus Exam: 17 of the 25 received a score of 3,4, or 5 and 7 received a perfect score of 5!





Class of '73 - 50th Reunion

Order of Brebeuf - 2023 Inductees

The 2023 Order of Saint Jean de Brebeuf Inductees were formally recognized at a Mass and Luncheon held on Sunday, November 12th with over 80 members of the Brebeuf community in attendance. The Order is the highest recognition the Brebeuf community bestows on those who have demonstrated the values for which the school has always stood. This year's celebration recognized the "9th class of inductees" and demonstrated that the Order has truly become a Brebeuf "tradition" as numerous past inductees and pillars of the school community as well as many students, returned to honour the 2023 current inductees:

Fr. Len Altilia, S.J. - Fr. Len has been associated with Brebeuf College School for over 50 years, having taught at Brebeuf in the early 1970's and served as a mentor to many Brebeuf students and alumni as director of Camp Ekon. Fr. Len holds the unique distinction of having served as Principal or President of three Jesuit high schools in Canada (Loyola in Montreal, Gonzaga in St. John's and St. Paul's in Winnipeg). He was instrumental in establishing Brebeuf's Kairos retreat program in 2010 and played a key leadership role in formulating the 2022 Endorsement Agreement between Brebeuf College, the TCDSB and the Jesuits of Canada, making Brebeuf once again a member of the Jesuit family of schools. For the past 20 years, Fr. Len has been a regular presence at Brebeuf to say Mass and hear confessions. He has also served in many senior administrative roles within the Jesuits of Canada. Throughout his years as a Jesuit, Fr. Len has been a shining example of a "Man for Others".

Robert Brohman '82 - Robert took advantage of many coaching opportunities as a teacher at Senator O'Connor College and Marshall McLuhan within the Toronto Catholic District School Board. He helped found the rugby programs, male and female, at both schools, winning championships with multiple teams. As well, Robert has coached curling, hockey and basketball within the school system. During his teaching career, Robert realized that leadership from within the group was the key to success. Most importantly, Robert saw the connection between extra-curricular activities and the personal growth of teenagers as leaders. Outside of teaching, Robert has been a club rugby coach and an Ontario Senior Women's coach. Most recently, he has volunteered at the Literacy Program at the Toronto Public Library and returned to Brebeuf to coach Junior Boys basketball and serve as a mentor for Brebeuf students.

As his main nominator **Robert Baldauf '82** noted, Robert believed that "the most important part of leadership is showing up". His scholarly and practical approach to leadership – built on the principle of "showing up" reflects the spirit and action of the saintly namesake of our school and the deserved recognition as a "Man for Others".

Aldo Di Felice '81 - Born in Argentina, Aldo's family immigrated to Canada when he was a child. After graduating from Brebeuf and becoming a lawyer, Aldo became directly involved with Canada's media sector when he joined Canadian TV and film production company Sullivan Entertainment as Chief Operating Officer. As president of TLN Media Group since 1998, Aldo has led an expansion strategy, launched new digital TV services in Italian, Spanish and English, forged new programming relationships, built community-oriented partnerships and created signature live events. Aldo has led TLN to engage with and support dozens of community groups and charities across the country over the past 25 years.

Order of Brebeuf - 2023 Inductees

In 2021, Aldo was appointed to the board of directors of Ontario Creates, an agency of the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport and a central catalyst for the cultural media sector. He previously served for 10 years as a board member of the provincial government agency known the Ontario Public Accountants Council. In 2019, Aldo was a recipient of the annual "10 most Influential Hispanic Canadians Awards". Aldo has been a member of the St. Michael's Hospital Presidents Council since 2009. Aldo has been a loyal supporter of Brebeuf and its students for many years and continues to be a "Man for Others".

Patrick Horgan '78 - recently retired after a lengthy career as a senior executive at IBM Canada, Patrick exemplifies what it means to be a "Man for Others". He has been extensively involved in local, provincial and national business, charitable and community organizations including serving as Chair of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, and serving on the boards of many civic organizations. . Most recently he served as Chair of Southlake Regional Health Centre in Newmarket, helping to guide the hospital through the pandemic.

While exemplifying his relentless pursuit of continuing education for others, he holds a Thompson Industrial Fellow position as part-time Adjunct Professor at Western University, focusing on AI and its implications to the University. Pat has been recognized with many awards including IBM Golden Circle, Hundred Percent Clubs and Leadership Excellence and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal for significant contributions to Canada.

Pat continues to connect all of us from the class of '78 by organizing and coordinating regular zoom calls. Pat Horgan is an outstanding individual in all aspects of life, and it is this graduate of Brebeuf College that inspires us today and every day.

Jim Morris '77 - Jim served on the first Alumni Association executive in 1982 and helped convene the annual alumni hockey and golf tournaments. During the 25th Anniversary celebrations in 1988, Jim oversaw the creation of the Brebeuf Sports Hall of Fame. Jim gave countless hours of his time and talents to helping his alma mater. When Brebeuf or one of its alumni needed his help, Jim was truly a Man for Others.

Even during his battle with cancer Jim continued to support Brebeuf, helping to organize the "Old School Alumni Reunion" in January, 2002. This event celebrated the closing of the original school building and marked the 25th Anniversary of the Junior Hockey Team's TDCAA Championship (for which Jim served as the team manager & trainer). At this event Jim was recognized with the "Man for Others" Award for his tireless dedication to Brebeuf.

Jim's journalism career in radio, primarily with CKO News and 680 News in Toronto focused on the Toronto police and fire beats. Jim was recognized with numerous awards throughout his distinguished career. Following his death in March, 2002, Brebeuf College established the Jim Morris Journalism Award to the graduating student excelling in journalism and mass media studies at Brebeuf.

Brebeuf Alumni in the Spotlight at Georgina Centre for Arts & Culture



In May 2023, a number of Tom's photos were showcased at the "7 Stories Photography Exhibit and Writing Contest" hosted by the GCAC. The objective of the contest was to write a story (in prose, poetry or non-fiction) inspired by one of the seven photographs. Within the seven short story contest categories, two alumni and classmates of Tom Zsolt, took home top honours.

Mark Beamish '77 won for his terrific short story based on the photo "Old Breckin".

Below are the two stories and the photos on which they are based. These two stories have been included in an anthology published by the GCAC and featuring Tom's photographs.



For me, churches aren't about religion by Paul Fraumeni

My religion, Catholicism, often drives me up the wall. But the churches work for me.

We all know the darkness of Catholicism. The religion doesn't allow same sex marriage, women cannot be priests, priests can't marry or have sex. The Church as a shameful history of pedophilia and abuse of Canadian Indigenous peoples.

But when I walk into a church, the political stances and even the religion itself float away. A welcome warmth comes over me. I find I can talk directly to God and Jesus, right through the religion. And that relationship makes me feel good.

For years, I would go into a church for the formal mass or for prayer. Usually, when it was prayer time, I was there to beg for something good to happen.

In 1986, my son Nicky was born. The next day, we were told he was born without one of his eyes. Initially, the doctors didn't know what that would mean in terms of his health or cognitive ability. As he stayed in St. Michael's Hospital and then Sick Kids in his early days, I went into St. Michael's Cathedral in Toronto and prayed – hard. "Please, Jesus, make Nicky better."

He didn't get 'better.' Nicky eventually was diagnosed as being profoundly mentally challenged. He lived until age 28. He couldn't walk or talk or take care of himself. He lived the best life he could. But the fact that all my praying didn't make him "ok" always bugged me.

But then I changed my perspective. I went into the cathedral, knelt down, blessed myself, looked up at Jesus on the cross and said, "You don't actually change things for us, do you? Not in some wave of the hand and all is good. So, from now on, no more prayers. I'm just going to tell you how I'm feeling."

And 35 years later, I'm still doing that. But I need a church to have that conversation. To me a church is a haven where I can talk openly and safely.

When I saw Tom Zsolt's photograph Stairway to Heaven, that feeling came over me. Tom's photo shows a stark environment that is not immediately inviting. The whiteness of the church, the feeling of intense heat from the surrounding desert.

But, it's a church. And even in a desert, for me, a church can be an oasis.

So much has changed since your last letter, here and everywhere. This Great War seems to have now reached across the ocean from Europe to find Canada and even our humble village of Brechin. It's hard to believe that my beloved Ellen and I were married less than a year ago at St. Andrew's Catholic Church.

All our friends, and O'Boyles far and wide, came to help us celebrate at the new St. Andrew's Hall just down the road. If you recall I even did some carpentry work there, and I'm proud to say it looks impressive. Mother dear, today I find myself back in St. Andrew's Hall again, but today there's no music. I'm starting this letter to you, as I wait in a long queue that goes out the door, filled with local lads and men of all ages, with our recruitment papers in hand. I'm ready to step up for my new home and country. Ireland has need to be proud of its people because we are bravely fighting for Canada, and why wouldn't we?

A fellow just told me that if we'd been recruited in Montreal we might have been assigned to the 199th Battalion of the Expeditionary force, an all-Irish regiment. One of the officers says Jimmy Duffy, our favourite marathoner from Sligo, is in this group.


Almost forgot to share Ellen's good news. We were gobsmacked to learn that because so many men have gone off to fight, there's places here hiring women to do jobs they wouldn't normally do. Right next door to the St. Andrew's Hall, in fact, is one of them, the Standard Bank of Canada. Ellen has always been good at the maths as you know, and yesterday she found out she'll be able to work some hours there, after I ship out.

Hard to believe, but grand news. Home now, just finishing this note so that I can post it first thing tomorrow. Mother, it is still my dream that you will leave Ballycara to join us here in Brechin one day, when the world is a safer place. Give my love to all.

With God's grace I will be safely back before you know it and you can finally come to stay with us for good.




Rev. Robert Charles (Padre) Brennan SJ

28 August 1945 - 2 September 2023

Fr. Rob Brennan, SJ, (Padre) passed peacefully on Saturday, September 2, at the Jesuit Infirmary, René Goupil House, in Pickering, ON. Fr. Brennan was 78 years old and about to celebrate his 53rd anniversary as a Jesuit. He entered the Jesuits on September 9, 1970, and was ordained a priest by Emmett Cardinal Carter on June 2, 1979. After tertianship in Manila, Philippines, he made final vows at Brebeuf High School in May 1984.

Rob's Jesuit life was defined by high school teaching and chaplaincy, and particularly by his connection with Loyola High School in Montreal. He spent time as a regent at Loyola High School in Montreal, then at Brebeuf in Toronto for 10 years, before returning to Loyola for a 12-year stint as chaplain. He then spent four years as coordinator of the pastoral team at Saint Paul's High School before returning to Loyola in 2006, where he was teacher, chaplain, and twice acting president and president of the high school.


Rob had a deep love for the students and faculty he accompanied and served as chaplain. He made deep and lasting connections with hundreds



A loyal community member, Rob could be counted on to enquire about the interests and the events in the life of his fellow Jesuits. He had a penchant for military and political history but could engage in discussion on many topics as a result of his wide interests and voracious reading. His struggles with illness later in life brought out a softer and more vulnerable side of his personality in his sharing with fellow community members.

He is survived by his sister, Mary Elizabeth Van Houten and her husband Stephen, by his nieces and nephews, and by numerous grand-nephews and grand-nieces.

Paul O'Neil '88 - Submitted by Brian O'Neil '92



I do not remember exactly when, but my first recollection was standing at the base of the stairwell leading into the foyer of the cafeteria and having a conversation with Eric. We were talking about the classes we had and their locations. I got along very well with Eric. I think this was due to our introverted nature. I found Eric to be a calm and humorous person who was very connected with his faith journey.

One year, we had a spare at the end of one day which allowed us to leave early. On one of those occasions, a conversation I had with Eric while walking toward the bus stop resonated with me and has stuck with me all these years. On my second last visit to see Eric, I mentioned this moment to him and to his mother. Eric recalled that moment too. He asked me if I attended Mass regularly. I was a C&E person at that point in my life. I really didn't know how to respond to his query. He then mentioned he went regularly and would walk to Mass even when there was a lot of snow. His faith was genuinely shown in his interactions with me and with others.

After high school, we drifted apart until I found him on social media. We chatted, but it wasn't everyday as we were both quite busy with work. When we were online, we would go back and forth for quite awhile. It felt as though after an absence of several years, we continued where we left off after graduation from Brebeuf. He always said positive things even when I was going through issues in life, whether it was with my brother or with my dear wife. He always suggested

ways to get out of the doghouse with the latter. He never took a side as we were all here for a short time and family was important to him. Eric deliberately chose to work at a location far from his home where he would be able to spend some time with his sister, Margaret, and her family. He also enjoyed his time camping with his nephews and nieces. His priority was family.

Eric's sense of humour was there right to the end. He told me to cry at his funeral. I told him in the last 10 years, I had only cried once and that was for our almost 21-year-old Melody back in the summer. He said, "You're overdue!"

On a numerous occasion, we talked about Jesus and God. Here are two thoughts he shared with me this past year:


"William, just remember when you feel most alone, he's closer than you think." We talked how we had no control when it came to leaving here and the strength of his faith. He also said at another time, "I'm not scared. I have my Shepherd and if he calls me, I'm here," which truly demonstrated his faith in Jesus.

He reminded me that my faith was very strong in Jesus and God. His positive support has helped me through personal things.

I am reminded of a Gospel passage in the Bible where Jesus talks about entering the kingdom of heaven. Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever becomes humble

like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." Eric's approach to his faith was like that of a child. He trusted in Jesus. He trusted in God. In our conversations, he never doubted his faith. His wish was to "see each other in the new kingdom."

Eric is in the hearts of his family and friends. I am thankful I had the opportunity to tell him it was an honour to know him. He truly did his best to be a child of God. May God warmly welcome Eric into His kingdom and may Eric rest eternally with Jesus and God celebrating his first Christmas with them in heaven.


