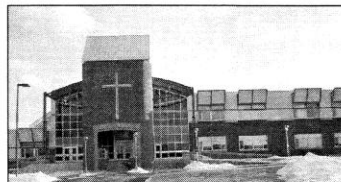

Thanks to the patient efforts of Brebeuf's former principal, Mr. Pautler, the administration team and the entire Brebeuf staff, 860 students, 49 teachers, and 18 support staff are happily ensconced in the "new Brebeuf." Mr. Pautler has since moved on to a new challenge as superintendent in another school board. We wish him well and thank him for his dedication during his tenure at Brebeuf. Now, the planning, the patient waiting, and the moving are all little more than distant memories. Without missing a step, Brebeuf College continues to fulfill its mission of educating young men in the Catholic tradition of academic excellence for the service of others.

This newsletter is testament to both that mission and to the vibrancy, energy, creativity, and dedication with which the Brebeuf community has embraced it. Whether it is in worship, academics, extra-curricular clubs, athletics, or the arts, the spirit of Brebeuf is evident in every aspect of school life.

The move to our new facility brought with it an increase in our enrolment and consequently our staff has grown in number. The Brebeuf community welcomes Mr. M. Aquino, Mr. A. Cavaiola, Mr. M. D'Angelo, Mr. J. DiFonzo, Mr. E. Guy, Mr. D. Jackson, Ms. J. Marley, and Mr. R. Sabatini. We wish them every success in their work with our students.

Our chaplaincy team has provided students with opportunities for spiritual growth. These have included: our retreat program, liturgies, First-Friday masses, and our daily paraliturgies. Our students put their faith into action in such altruistic undertakings as the collections in support of the Presentation Brothers' missions in Africa and the Caribbean and the generous donation made to the Rose of Sharon charity. In December, students will be collecting food items for Can-Aid, Brebeuf's annual food drive in support of the Good Shepherd Refuge.



A highlight of our fall term was the annual Muskoka Woods orientation experience for our grade nine students. 200 students participated in the three-day camp during which they formed new bonds with

teachers and peers and became acquainted with the traditions and spirit of Brebeuf.

On the academic front, our varied programs continue to enrich the academic experience of our students. This year Brebeuf has added 55 new computers to its state-of-the-art labs and through the generosity of our CSAC we were able to furnish our library with 4 new computers. With the imminent launch of the cutting-edge BNN (Brebeuf News Network) Mr. Naccarato, Mr. MacDonald and students will push the envelope of media and communication technology. With BNN and the student newspaper, "The B", students will not want for timely and pertinent information.

This fall Brebeufians have shown their indomitable competitive spirit on the playing field. We are proud of the exploits of our senior volleyball team which is now preparing for the playoffs. We congratulate our junior soccer team for advancing far into the playoffs before their narrow loss to a rival school. In cross country, we acknowledge the dedication of all our runners. We are particularly proud of Adam Dykes who represented Brebeuf at OFSAA on November 6th, 2004.

In the arts, our students, under the direction of Mr. Adams and Mr. MacDonald, produced *Every Body Is a Somebody*, a musical dealing with themes of positive body image and self-esteem. On December 1, 2004 they staged performances of *Every Body Is a Somebody* for students from elementary schools.

On every front, Brebeuf College has been a beehive of activity this fall. We have had an exciting start which augurs well for the remainder of the year.

This academic program enables high school students to award \$5,000 grants to grassroots community charities. The Grade Ten Civics class at Brebeuf College School in Willowdale took on the project for their social justice unit.

They visited Rose of Sharon, met with staff and then created a PowerPoint presentation. With the information gathered, they delivered their presentation to a panel of ten judges and approximately 200 students. 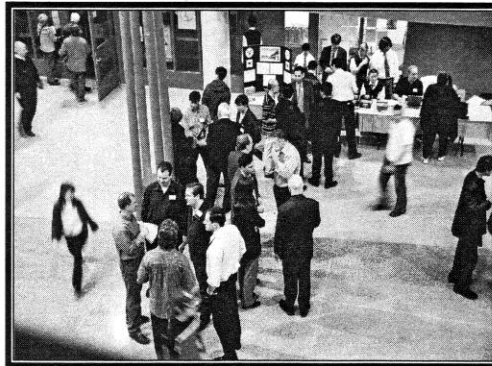
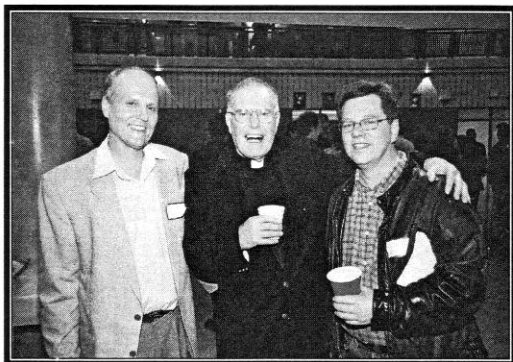
After the speeches, the Atrium and Cafeteria became a pub and place for people to meet old friends and teachers.

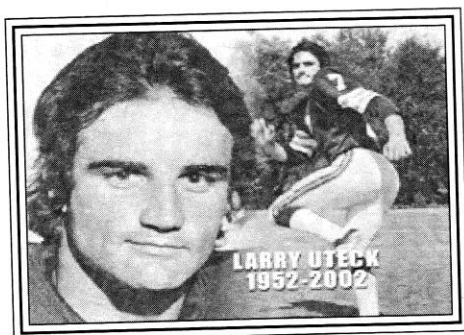

Larry Uteck, of the class of 1970, was a star athlete and scholar in his years at Brebeuf. After graduation, Larry won a football scholarship to the University of Colorado, at a time when Canadian athletes did not win such awards. He eventually went on to a stellar career with the Canadian Football League. He was the football coach for the St. Mary's University Huskies and coached many Vanier Cup teams.

Brebeuf could not have chosen a better person after whom to name our field

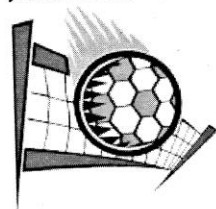
SENIOR BOYS VOLLEYBALL PLAYOFF RUN

The Brebeuf Math Department is proud to announce the results from the Waterloo Math Contests in February, for Grades 9, 10 and 11.

In the Grade 11 Fermat Contest, our top student with a score of 120 was Eunjong Yoo, followed closely by Jeff Lu and David Lam. Our team score of 346 places Brebeuf eleventh among North York schools.

In the Grade 10 Cayley Contest, Eric Huh led the way with an amazing score of 130. Eric's score places him in the top 100 students in Metro Toronto for this contest. Gabriel Kim, Chi Ho Wong and Derek Wan also scored at or above the 120 mark for the Cayley Contest.

Finally in the Grade 9 Pascal Contest, our top student was Kevin Ku with an excellent score of 128. Kevin was followed by Daniel Lee and Nikolas Quaasalmay.

Overall, 20 of our 30 competitors in these competitions merited certificates of distinction for finishing in the upper 25% of all competitors Canada wide. Well done gentlemen!

Brebeuf offers a varied programme for students identified as gifted and for all students who want an enriched educational experience. Some of the programmes offered include:

- * **Enriched courses** for Grades 10-12 in English, math, and science. By Grade 12, students will work at a university level and will be prepared to write Advanced Placement examinations that could exempt them from certain university courses.

- * **Independent study credits**, including courses that Brebeuf does not currently offer;

- * **Interdisciplinary credits**, which combine two subjects into one;

- * **Overseas credits** earned in other countries, including Ireland, England, Scotland, Italy, and France;

- * **Advice** on modifying courses with the cooperation of the classroom teacher to make study more challenging.

As well, a large number of extracurricular activities are run through the Gifted Programme to appeal to students seeking enrichment, including: model United Nations, mock trial, robotics challenge, Synergy (literary magazine), gifted conferences, Brebeuf Book Club, Triple Bronze (poetry anthology), The B newspaper, etc. A monthly newsletter called **I.Q.@B** gives students information on upcoming enrichment activities.

THEATRE BREBEUF

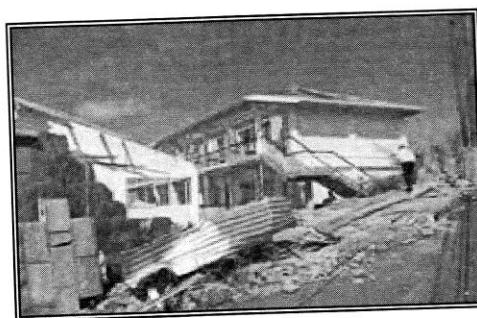
