TOM BUTASH RETIRES

The halls of Brebeuf have been truly alive with the sound of music since 1979, thanks to the hard work and commitment of music teacher Mr. Tom Butash, who retires this June after thirty-one years of teaching.

When he was hired by Father Rye, Brebeuf didn't have a music room, just a portable! Under Mr. Butash, the concert and stage bands travelled the world to such destinations as Rome, Hawaii, Florida, and Scranton, PA (his home town). With the arrival of full-funding, the music programme exploded and other teachers joined Mr. Butash in a new music room in the old "portapak". From the exile to Bathurst Heights and the return to the new building, he oversaw such innovations as the introduction of guitar and keyboarding courses. Brebeuf also began participating in Kiwanis music festivals, where our bands always excelled.

Whatever the location or era, Mr. Butash has remained a dedicated teacher with a passion for music, a commitment to helping his students to succeed, and a generous role model of the Catholic faith.

T o honour Mr. Butash's legacy at Brebeuf, a new award has been instituted. **The Thomas Butash Music Award** will recognize the student with the highest average in Grade 12 music.

We wish Mr. Butash a wonderful retirement and hope he will visit Brebeuf often! (MD)

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE







BREBEUF YOUTH MINISTRY



In a world of violent video games, individualism and societal vices, many teenagers find it difficult to practise their faith. The Brebeuf Youth Ministry, comprised of over 100 students and staff members, serves as a place where the students of Brebeuf College can not only practise their faith, but embrace it. Through activities such as praying the Rosary in all homeroom classes during the Marian months of October and May, the students are able to develop a deeper connection with Christ, while encouraging others to do the same. Similarly, through retreats such as the Salesian Leadership Retreat and Kairos Jesuit Retreat, students are able to see that their faith extends past the walls of Brebeuf College; it allows them to see that they are part of a larger faith community. The newly formed Brebeuf Bulls Support Group provides students with a safe environment to seek advice, consolation and support during times of personal struggle. With many other ministries, such as the Music Ministry and Liturgical Ministry, there are many opportunities for all students to get involved. James 2:24 tells us that "a person is justified by works and not by faith alone." The Brebeuf Youth Ministry gives students the chance to develop both.

KAIROS – GOD'S TIME



This year marked the beginning of a new Brebeuf tradition: Kairos. This grade eleven retreat programme was introduced to the school last fall, when a dozen Brebeufians attended "Kairos 1". Led by a group of graduating students who had attended this Jesuit retreat in Buffalo in 2009, the first Kairos was both a learning process and a success, paving the way for the second retreat held May 12-14 at Manresa Retreat Centre in Pickering.

Kairos translates to "God's Time," which is the best way to describe this three day experience, shared among a group of students who have already spent three years of high school together, yet may not truly know one another. The retreat allows the students to take a step back from their everyday life, contemplate their lives and consider the presence of faith, all in a loving and trusting environment. The purpose of the retreat is to focus on relationship with others, with ourselves, and with God.

Kairos has already seen a great deal of growth within its inaugural year, as the second retreat was attended by more than 30 retreatants. With the help of Fr. Len Altilia S.J. and Chris Krall S.J. and student and teacher leaders, including Mr. DiMauro, Mr. Gregoris, Mr. Guy, Mr. Jenkins, Mr. Rebello, and Mr. Da Costa, Kairos will continue to grow. This is a Brebeuf experience that truly makes this school a brotherhood, and it is only a matter of time before this tradition takes off and Kairos 50 is just around the bend.

SALESIAN LEADERSHIP RETREATS

SLR is not known for what it was, rather for how it changed the lives of every retreatant over the course of 3 days. 30 girls and 30 boys were chosen from Catholic schools to go and while they wanted to find friendship first and God second, they found a family centred on faith. The retreat was founded by the Salesians and structured around their way of life and their calling. What made the retreat so unique and special was the environment created for the young adults to open up

and share. My experience of the retreat was unique to me as it was to each individual who went up. I have never been the same since God lead me on this journey to find a path for myself bonded strongly in my faith. It was a path with many obstacles and change was the only answer. The day after returning from SLR is always the hardest. It's not because you're tired from the lack of sleep or because you have a lot of work to catch up on. It's because of the revelation that the world is not ready for someone who has been so moved by God. But don't take my word for it. The retreat is yours to experience. Take out of it what you're willing to put into it, but all I can advise you to do is 'Participate, don't anticipate.' The Salesian Leadership Retreat helped me take a look at the man in the mirror, ask him to change his ways and prepare to face the biggest challenge of his life, a world unready for change.

CSI: BREBEUF

This spring, Ms. Johnston's grade 12 biology class had the pleasure of visiting the Ontario Science Centre to do what forensic scientists do every day. Getting up bright and early we experienced a very full day of education and fun (with the help of the Science Centre's staff in a real

biotechnology lab) and the students of Brebeuf actually visualized their very own DNA!

The excursion began with some cringing when we were kindly asked to extract a few of our own individual strands of hair. It was not as easy as you might think we needed to ensure that the hairs were taken at the root where the living cells, and thus our precious DNA, resides. Along the way, through a series of precise steps. the small sample of DNA that we took from our hair was replicated into millions and millions of copies. And that was just the morning protocol! After completing this Polymerase Chain Reaction (know simply as PCR to those in the forensics field), the afternoon was spent learning the theory behind DNA "Fingerprinting" (which has nothing to do with our fingers at all). Using our new skills, we actually separated our own DNA into our almost unique "fingerprint" by the complex process of Electrophoresis. Has your mind expanded yet? As soon as we left the lab we proceeded to be entertained by the Science Centre's exhibits.

Back at Brebeuf the next day, we were relieved to receive our results and learn that 19 out of 20 of us got results! It would have been very easy to mess up any of the steps so Ms. Johnston was proud of our achievement.

For most of us it was the first time we got to use sophisticated biochemistry lab equipment like a micropipette, a vortex and centrifuge. Truth be told, the experiment was amazing. We learned a lot and actually had a lot of fun doing it (of course some of that was because we got to play with K-nex). This trip just showed the wonders of modern biology and its applications.


GHANA IMMERSION TRIP 2011

ghana reflections

I had the privilege to be invited by Brother Martin Kenneally F.P.M, Congregation Leader of the Presentation Brothers, to visit Ghana and the missions of the Brothers there. I was truly taken aback and humbled by this generous offer. I have always been curious to see their schools and meet the students and the people involved in running them, and so I overcame some initial fears and visited during the March Break.

When Brother Rupert O'Sullivan, the Provincial superior and my host, and I arrived at St. Charles' School in Yendi, we were literally swarmed by the happy school children from the adjacent primary school. St Charles is the newest school associated with the Presentation Brothers, and has been the main recipient of donations raised by the Bro. Maher Fund. By Canadian standards, the school is very basic and accommodates 350 pupils. Classrooms have up to 60 children per class and have no air-conditioning, despite 35 degree weather and humidity. The chalkboards are



made of rough wood. Students sit crammed together at desks built for half as many. Despite the conditions, however, the pupils appeared happy, keen to be at

school, and very polite and respectful. They know education is the way to better their futures and those of their families. I was happy to present a plaque with the Brebeuf crest, a Canadian flag, and a soccer ball as tokens of the friendship between our schools. The school is grateful for our help, which has provided: - electricity for fans, which help make the environment more conducive for learning;

- maintenance for the computer lab;
- dictionaries and books for the library;
- other essential supplies for students and teachers.

I also had the chance to visit Presentation Junior High School in Logre, which is expertly run by Brother Andrew Asinga FPM, the Principal. This school had the



best examination results in its district. Students are fed lunches three times a week, thanks to a feeding programme funded by Presenation Brothers College in Cork and Presentation College Bray in Ireland. When I asked Bro. Andrew how we at Brebeuf could help, he mentioned that many students could not afford to attend secondary school after leaving Pres. The Bro. Maher Scholarships were born on the spot, and the next day I was able to meet the students, Georgina and Michael, who would benefit from them. The smiles on their faces were priceless!



There are many other Presentation initiatives in Ghana. Bro. Joe Gilleece showed me a health and maternity clinic that has been invaluable to the people. Many

communities also have clean water thanks to wells provided by the Brothers. Lay Presentation Volunteers from Ireland teach in a local teachers training college and secondary school and have set up a charity to help an orphanage.

Overall, I am left with very fond memories of my visit. The Ghanaian people are friendly, welcoming, religious, and hopeful, and grateful beneficiaries of the international assistance they receive. The Brothers are true Christians and "men for others". Their mission is a modern incarnation of the vision of Blessed Edmund Rice, who similarly transformed 19th century Ireland through Christian education of the young.
