PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTIONS



Where has the time gone? It only seems like yesterday that we were welcoming students back to a full day of school while still adhering to the many COVID protocols – and this continues to be the case! There is no doubt that this year, like the previous two, has been like no other; however, despite the challenges, students and staff have arisen to the occasion, continuing to ensure that Brebeuf remains a dynamic school with students at the heart of what we do. In a special way, I'd like to thank our amazing staff and students who have accomplished so much thus far. A special thanks to each of them for putting their faith into action in tangible ways!

Last year, as a staff, we started a journey on refocusing and being intentional on celebrating and speaking candidly about our school Pillars. All stakeholders were involved in the process and what came from the focus groups and feedback were four solid Pillars - FAITH, **EXCELLENCE, TRADITION and FELLOWSHIP** that have now become the foundation for our community. Coupled with this, we started looking at our religious roots; we termed it the two lungs – Jesuit and Presentation Brothers traditions - and started exploring a Jesuit endorsement that would permit Brebeuf College School to celebrate and deliver Jesuit pedagogy in the classroom and school. We had Fr. Len Altilia, S.J. address the staff at a PD Day in September, and he did a wonderful job to set the stage for this pending endorsement with the Jesuits. I'm happy to report that at the time of this message, we are nearing ever closer to this endorsement that will further highlight our Pillar of Faith and will also allow us to continue to keep the Presentation Brothers and their tradition in the forefront. There is a lot of overlap with both spiritualities!

With the refocus and commitment to our school Pillars and in this case the Pillar of Fellowship, we have also kicked off a revamped House System and Mentorship System. The House System has all students assigned to one of six Houses – Jogues, Lalemant, Daniel, Lalande, Garnier, Chabanel – and students compete with other Houses for House prizes, etc. This really speaks to our Pillar of Fellowship and building the amazing brotherhood at Brebeuf College School. Our senior students, who applied for a Prefect Leadership position last year, have been absolute stars in supporting our Grade 9 students and have already brought our Grade 9s together for fun activities (the AMAZING RACE in December), intramurals, fellowship, etc. Coupled with the above, there are so many other amazing things happening at Brebeuf that speak to our Pillars!

Our Pillar of Excellence is well and alive with students participating in interschool sports through our varsity Football, Jr. Soccer, Sr. Volleyball, Hockey Teams and really building fellowship and brotherhood. On deck and with the easing of restrictions, we hope to offer badminton, Jr. Volleyball, Sr. Soccer and Baseball! Our Robotics Team has also been working away diligently and placed very well in their February competition, while a number of Grade 9 students faired very well in the Math Beaver competition earlier in Semester 1. Along with this, our Grade 10, 11 and returning 12s wrote the OSSLT and many found great success in fulfilling that requirement. A special thanks for the phenomenal effort from our Staff Literacy Team who put it all together! Numeracy and Literacy and building Excellence in these areas will continue to be a major focus at Brebeuf College School. As we look ahead and continue to build on our School Pillars, students are continually being asked to live up to our school expectations of coming to school on time, being in complete uniform and learning to achieve success for their future through grit and resilience. It is important for us to know each of our students personally and we look forward to continuing to do this.

Our Pillar of Tradition has also been taking shape with a renewed emphasis on connecting with our Alumni for our Prefect programme and trying to build a mentorship programme with our Alumni that runs through our House System. More details will be forthcoming, and we thank all Alumni who have said "yes". Along with this, during the Christmas season we were also able to offer amazing activities that were important to the fabric and tradition at Brebeuf, such as the St. Vincent De Paul clothing drive, Beuf Boxes, and raising money for the Presentation Brothers' schools in Africa. Along with this, we continue to celebrate our Presentation Brothers' history with the Angelus at 10:00 a.m. each day and we look forward to building upon our Jesuit Tradition with praying the Examen each Monday at 10:00am – it's an amazing reflective prayer to help our boys with their mental health and wellbeing. Lastly, I'd like to welcome our Jesuit Scholastics to Brebeuf who have been interacting with our students through Grade level Retreats since September! It's amazing to have them on board!

These are just a few highlights of how our school Pillars are coming alive! Of course, our Pillar of Faith continues to move all Pillars and breathe life into our Catholic school just like the Holy Spirit. Our Youth Ministry has been very involved with our Sacraments, building a partnership with St. Joseph's Morrow Park, presenting our *Qui Vadis* series in which Alumni Brebeuf Clergy speak of their faith journey. As we journey into Lent, let us always be reminded that regardless of the challenges and crosses we carry, there is renewed life through the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The resilience, grit, and humility that Jesus showed throughout the 40 days (and during his life) exemplify the traits that we want to develop in our boys at Brebeuf College School. 

The flag will become a teaching tool for us to learn more about the Wendat and methods of genuine Reconciliation.


ROBOTICS ROOKIES TO ROCKSTARS



A big congratulations to our Brebotics Robotics team who competed in the FIRST FTC Provincial Championships this February. The team qualified for provincials twice by ranking first in the North Bay Qualifiers and by having a fourth overall score in the North York Qualifiers. The team improved their score from a run average of 105 points to 142 points, despite COVID lockdown challenges. Brebotics ranked thirteenth overall at Provincials! Approximately eighty teams competed in Ontario and thirty-six competed at Provincials. Brebotics is also the first team in FIRST Robotics history to have the same Dean's List Finalist win twice in our Division. Only six finalists are chosen in Canada. The team worked hard to represent Brebeuf well at the top level and did outstanding work that will position us competitively for the future. Brebotics is currently preparing outreach STEM events, mentoring initiatives, marketing, and preparing for a tentative spring tournament.

MATH UPDATE

This year, 2021-2022 the Enriched Brebeuf Mathematics programme is well on track toward helping over ninety boys excel at high level mathematics. Due to complications arising from Covid protocols, this year has been divided up into two two-period days in the first Semester, and now back to a regular four-period day in the second Semester. There still are students who have opted for virtual learning, thus diminishing the overall number of students in regular Brebeuf College day school.

In Semester One, a Grade 11 class easily finished the course at midterm and completed most of the Grade 12 Advanced Functions course by the end. This class has started up with me again in Semester #2 to do their AP calculus work. The class will have the chance to write the AP-AB Calculus exam in May and therefore we will need to work very hard to prepare for it. In Semester #2 the Grade 12 Enriched Calculus and Vectors class are working with vectors, will then review all first year University Calculus, and will continue to work on second year University Calculus. They have the option of writing the AP-BC Calculus exam in May, and I would expect that most of them would be able to obtain near perfect on the exam if they choose to do so.

The Brebeuf STEAM programme is now fully set up and there are two Grade 9 STEAM-Enriched math classes that finished their course with me in Semester One. Class averages for these classes were very good and I am most proud of all these students and commend them for their hard work and effort toward achieving excellence in mathematics.


DEBATING
